Why are the Subdivided Unit Residents Disproportionately Burdened under Escalating Extreme Weather in Hong Kong?

Clean Air Network continues to place emphasis on indoor air quality, as numerous scientific studies have indicated that long-term residence in spaces with substandard air quality in subdivided units can lead to physical and mental health issues, and local extreme weather events may further exacerbate the situation.

The government's "Task Force on Subdivided Units" is planning to set "Minimum Standards for Subdivided Unit Living Environment". CAN welcomes these measures and suggested that the related "standards" should encompass aspects including indoor air quality to ensure a hygienic living environment in our previous submission.

As extreme weather events become increasingly frequent and severe, the need for decisive government action to protect the well-being of subdivided unit residents has never been more urgent. Together, we can drive changes to build a healthier living environment in Hong Kong.


Clean Air Student Council welcomes new members in the new school year
